UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

The plat for Lots 1, 2 and 3, Enterprise 1st Addition to the City of Jefferson, Union County, South Dakota; and the request of the prescriptive easement was tabled previously. CA Kaleigh Koch advised the City Council that the ongoing contact with Mr. Potratz's attorney with Crary Huff Law Firm indicates a formal approval of the proposed plat may no longer be necessary.

The trailer park at 615 Main Street was discussed. There is progress on trailer #2 and #3. The owner of trailer #4 had someone she knows look at the trailer and they told her the trailer was fine. Gary Roan, our building inspector, emailed a list of deficiencies for the 4th trailer to city hall. FO Roark shared that list with the City Council. The FO informed the City Council the variance request for 709 Main Street has been pending for quite some time. The initial contact with BNSF RR concerning the variance was in October 2024. The notice for the variance request was published May 15, 2025. Alec Becker was present to request a variance of 6.32 feet for the front yard and 15 feet for the rear yard. A discussion followed.
